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2022 Northwest Champs/5 Days In Tangent

Report by Bruce Hannah, CD

I arrived at the field on Parker road around 11 AM on Tue. the 16th. Was hoping to do some testing but the wind was around 10 to 15 mph. Good news was the next day, Wed. the first day of the contest it was calm. We had trailers and tents all around the outer edge along Parker Road. The sign ups started out slow and by the end of that day we had 30 or so entries. As the day progressed the wind came from every direction at one time or another but remained light. It was hot but that did not stop Bob DeShields from setting a new National record in Cat 3 ROW rubber at 718 sec. Robert Hauk also broke the record but was just a few sec. behind. There was one more thing that was new to me we had about 20 pigs that would be wondering about the area all weekend.

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The next day was Pro P-30 which started about 8 AM I think 9 or so contestants which makes it one of our largest groups for that event. It was going to be a tuff day as only 4 put up a max in the first round, by the end of the day 3 had maxed out, Dave Ives, Jon Sayre and Bruce Hannah. We chose to go with a 3 min. flight with a 15 min. window. Dave was the only one to max that flight with Jon 2nd and me 3rd. Looking at the contestant sheet showed that more people had been signing up to fly giving me hope that the 5 day thing was working.

Friday did not start out well with a strong wind blowing to the North and across the only plowed area which was very hard to cross with a bike. The FAI guys moved down to the south end of the field but we stayed on seeing a report that the wind would be changing, it didn't. A few flew and had some very long chases, but most just took the day off because the weather looked very good for the next 2 days. After all we did have 5 days so if we lose one, there was time to make it up. We moved the Vintage Power to Sat. and made the rounds an hour and a half so the guys that fly both Wake and power could still fly both. Not ideal but it worked out OK.

So Sat. was just as we had hoped it would be - calm. I won't go into to any detail as others will but 17 entered and 16 flew Vintage power (a new high), and 9 in Vintage Wake also a new high. So many flew Vintage power that very few other gas events were flown that morning. I have to mention that if the Menanno's all show up you know it going to be a good contest, and they did not let us down. Guy won so many events, Sara, Forrest and Alfons also did well. The other family of note was the Smith's with 3 generations flying.

OK now on to Sun. it was maybe the best day and had lots of flying being done. Modelers were all over the place trying to get in one more event. We called the meet at 2:30 with people still putting in flights right to the end. Now before I finish I have to thank Linda Grell for the great dinner, Bruce Grell for his tireless work on the table for 5 days, Glenn Grell for making sure we had a place to fly and Mark Sexton ,Jim Tailor for the live music, Sara Menanno for all her work helping me to make this whole thing come together. 5 days, 763 official flights, 210 fly off flights, 48 events, 64 contestants with the FAI people. These are times that make memories. Thanks to all,

Low Doc Scale

The entries for Low Doc for the contest included some new contenders plus a couple of well-trimmed winners from past seasons. Peter Becker entered a nice rubber powered De Havilland Leopard Moth that appeared to have been built as a very lightweight indoor competitor. Ted Vernon brought another interesting new racer with a bright yellow and red rubber powered Cessna Cr3 as well as his tried and true Pietenpol Air Camper. Ted's Air Camper is only the second model to attain full static points in my tenure as judge. The real stunner was Nigel Tarvin's electric powered Bristol M1D. Resplendant in perfect black and red tissue it was a very nice addition to what I call the "Airplane Museum". They were joined by Tom Kopriva's electric Legal Eagle and Robert Hauk's rubber powered Fairchild PT-19.

In the end Robert's Fairchild took first place with a superb all-around flight performance complete with a curious buzz of rubber knot making it sound like a real motor. Tom Kopriva took second with another great flight complete with a nice, slow realistic home built takeoff, though a bit unsteady in descent. Nigel Tarvin took third with flight of 2:17 that would have qualified as a max in other events. Bill Swift your Scale Judge

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Vintage FAI Power and Wakefield Report- August 20, 2022

Report by Bob Stalick, Event Director

The big Vintage FAI Power Contest was set for Friday, August 19, but the winds were coming from the SW at a higher than expected speed and blowing right over a plowed portion of the field North of our launch site. A survey of fliers showed little interest in moving to the southern end of the field to allow for a much longer drift area. We decided to wait until 9 am to make a final decision. In the interim, discussions indicated a desire to combine Power with the scheduled Vintage Wakefield event set for Saturday, as the weather was predicted to be better. Rounds would be expanded to 90 minutes to allow for those who were flying both events to have adequate prep time. At 9 am, with the weather not improving, the decision was made: Saturday would be the day!

We had processed nearly all of the power models on thursday afternoon, so the morning of August 20 was much less hectic than usual. The winds had died down quite a bit and it appeared they were shifting to come more from the west, giving us a large retrieval area, even though the powerlines were in that direction. As you can see from the scores, we had 17 entries in Power and 9 in Wakefield, with 5 folks entering both events. Early flights showed a lack of trim with several of the entries, including an unfortunate quick remote DT effected by Ray Pope, after his Lucky Lindy went off pattern and appeared headed for the cars and occupants. Ray pushed the button, and the ship DTed as the wing collapsed. The model was seriously damaged, but no one or no thing was hurt. We recorded his score so that he could qualify for the special Larry Conover Certificate awarded at this meet.

The winds finally began to shift even more from the west as the morning progressed. It was a vindication of the wisdom of moving the event to Saturday. I was pleased to see some new faces in these events. Kevin Smith was a newby and acquitted himself well in power as did Roger LaPrelle. Bill Koran showed with one of my favorite Wakefield models, Bob Hatschek's Skyscraper.

Bill Vanderbeek and Nigel Tarvin were both flying diesel powered models, which were trimmed out on the field. Fortunately, both were flying some distance from the scoreboard, because the smell of those things is not a favorite of mine.

As the day wore on, we were able to compress two rounds, which we usually do when all contestants have completed their official flights. Not everyone was happy with this move, but it did give us a bit of flexibility for the expected flyoff. If we needed flyoffs, they would not start until around 3:30 - 4 pm, and Saturday evening is the big potluck at the Grell farm, which gets underway around 6 pm.

At the end of 4 rounds, only Gordon Dona was clean in Wakefield, so no flyoffs needed. But we had a 4 way tie in power: Swift, Hannah, Bob DeShields and Decker. I was hoping one or two would drop his fifth flight to make flyoffs simpler. In fact, we had plans to do part of it on Sunday if needed. Big Surprise: All 4 dropped their fifth flights. Hannah hit the power lines in the glide and seriously damaged his venerable Monks Model. The other 3 just had crummy air and were down in under 3 minutes. Flyoff averted!

All the prizes were given out after the event. Bruce Hannah awarded WMC Medallions to the Wakefield winners and first and second place also got Wayne Smith reverse Montreal stop front end assemblies. The Vintage Power winners also got WMC Medallions and a number of special awards which were part of the delayed Cranfield 60th Anniversary (from 2020). We were finally able to award them this year.

The turnout for both Wakefield and Power were the largest since we have been hosting these events. I also know that several fliers (some named Menanno ,plus a Stalick) had Vintage models but did not enter. Next year, I'd like to get 20 in Power and 10 in Wakefield. That would be serious!

Thanks to all who competed and enjoyed these two events. Thanks also to my two cohiorts who were huge helps: Bill Swift and Bruce Grell. I had a blast running the event.





- 5. Old Timer Event Rules: Model must be 1951 (and certain designs up to 1957) as per SAM rules. Spark ignition only. Engine Run Times: Pylon or Fuselage models 20 seconds ROG and 15 seconds HL. O& R 23 Event models open to any SAM eligible Antique or Old Timer model powered by an O & R 23. All maxes are 2 minutes. All attempts are 20 seconds. Flyoffs will have a decreasing engine run format.
- 6. 1/2A Golden Age event. Model design must be between 1957-1969. Engines allowed: TD 049-051 or Holland Hornet 049-051 only. Engine runs are same as Nostalgia-9 sec. HL or 10 sec. ROG/VTO.
- 7. E-20 : Flight Rules: 20 second motor run/90 second max. 20 second attempt. Flyoffs are 10 second motor run and 120 second max.


