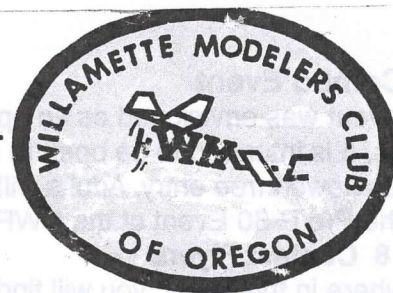

Larry passed away on March 18 after a long battle with Leukemia and a broken hip due to a recent fall. I first met Larry and Freddi about 25 years ago, and both of them have been big part of the WMC--mostly behind the scenes since then..The following email was sent to his friends and fellow club members by President Glenn Grell:

"I received news last night that Larry Wacken passed away yesterday afternoon. Larry was the Vice President of the WMC for many years and ran the Collecto at our SPOT meet in September. He was also part of the gang that folded, stamped and mailed the WMC newsletter, He also had helped with CD duties a number of years back. Larry has not been as active the last couple of years due his medical problems. Larry was a true gentleman and will be missed by all that knew him. There will be a celebration of Life at a later date.

†Steve Riley - RIP

Steve Riley was a two time member of the WMC. He joined initially in the mid-1970's when he lived in Eugene. Sometime in the 1990's, he and his wife, Jeri, moved to the Southwest, and he was active in free flight scene in the Phoenix area, including editing their club newsletter for a time. More recently, he was instrumental in obtaining use of the Round Valley Dome in Eager, AZ, now the site of several Nats events. Steve and Jeri moved back to Oregon in the mid-2010's finally settling in Albany. Steve competed in indoor events, and was a regular at club meetings with interesting show and tell gadgets and techniques. Less than two years ago, they moved to East Texas. Steve had been suffering from issues with back pain and was hospitalized in Texas. Jeri called Glenn Grell and told him that Steve had passed away on Feb. 21. He was 80 years old.

We had thirteen flyers sign up and the contest began with catapult gliders. All three of the entries showed good form by getting their gliders up into the sweet spot just below the lights.... on most of their launches.

The morning flying continued and there seems to be growing interest in scale and we witnessed several impressive flights.

Mark Allison impressed everyone with his high flying Lacey pistachio. He managed to land on a speaker not once but twice. It was freed with a balloon both times without damage. We had three or four WWII era No-Cals...maybe a mass launch next month?

P-18 mass launch got eight P-18s into the air a few minutes after noon. Robert Hauk ended up the winner with a time of almost two and a half minutes, his first mass launch win. Flying continued through the afternoon with the 'heavies and lightweight duration model sharing the airspace. Everyone was cooperative and no problems arose. It's really great to see the newer flyers having so much fun, their enthusiasm is contagious!

There was a discussion about resetting the high time records since we are flying no-touch now.

Mid afternoon the scores were tallied and everyone took a turn at the prizes.

March 12 Indoor Contest

We had talked Bruce Grell into being the CD of this meet, and as expected, he did a great job. Of course, indoor meets are much more relaxed than our outdoor contests, but non-the-less, he did it. The meet itself went off without a hitch, other than the upstairs gym entrance is now sporting a locked gate, and a couple of models drifted into the gated area. his necessitated a phone call to the school custodian, who rescued Jim Alderson's NoCal Waterman Racer.

It is really enjoyable to see the group that Mark Allison is helping grow into this event. They come to the meet and just seem to have a good time. I should mention that more than one contestant discovered that this was the first day of Daylight Savings Time, and were a bit late in arriving.

Mass Launch is getting to be a management handful. This time we had 10 entrants a few more that we had timers. It was quite a sight to see 10 P-18 models launched at the same time--and I didn't see any collisions at all. Mark Allison played the violin to accompany the event and added a nice touch to the entire affair. David Cammack, who is developing into an accomplished indoor competitor, won first place with a respectable 2 :34 score. It's always a treat for me to have my son, Tom, come to these meets. Once again he brought his Ornithopter and racked up a flight of 1:42--very respectable!

Roger LaPrelle entered his first event indoor meet with a brand new P-18 model, finished the night before. He placed in both the P-18 and Mass Launch events with this model. We had 14 contestants who entered--a new record for recent years. Maybe we are seeing a resurgence in indoor here in Oregon.

Fun Scale Guidelines WMC meeting 3-18-23

If you have never entered Scale, but have an interest in replicating a real plane, have a kit on the shelf, a plan of a favorite or a half-completed model, put one together and have some fun with Fun Scale.

The event is proposed as a first step into our Low Doc Scale event. Unlike that event Fun Scale requires only a model, the plan the model was built from and a flight time of 20 seconds with no ROG requirement. The emphasis is not on fine detail or fancy features or finishes but rather on scale-like stable flight. Bystanders should recognize the subject as an authentic plane that looks good from a distance but flies well.

1. As this is a scale event that shows off a modeler's various abilities, the builder of the model rule applies. No ARFs, ARTCs, etc. If it is prebuilt it will not qualify.
2. The model must be a replica of a human-carrying plane built by the entrant. It can be powered by any means (hint: if it is powered by a Pee Wee .020, it is eligible for the Pee Wee Palooza).
3. The model can be constructed from a kit, from plans with scaling permitted. The plan itself will serve as authentication for the craft. The model will match the outlines of the plan and require a built-up fuselage (no profiles or No-Cals).
4. Subjects with fixed landing gear require landing gear built-in while those with retracts can be presented with the gear up or down.
5. Models may be finished in either tissue or paint but no other surface details need be presented.
6. No fine detail such as instrument panels, pilots, separate control surfaces, engines, louvers, rigging need be presented nor will they be scored.

Static Judging will be done in two phases. The first will be a review of the model's plan compared to the model. If outlines are accurate, the model will qualify. The second phase will be a People's Choice phase that will be conducted at the Spaghetti Feed or other social event on Saturday night. The models will be lined up on a table with cups at each model. Attendees who wish to participate will place a single token at their model. The model that gains the most tokens will take home the People's Choice award, as yet unspecified. The builder of the model will remain anonymous by simply numbering each models' cup. To qualify for static judging the model must have previously achieved a 20 second qualifying flight.

Flight judging will take place early Sunday morning after the Low Doc Scale flights have been completed. Judging will consider the models flight pattern from launch and fly out, through a scale phase, and finish with the models descent to just before actual landing. The model should fly from launch in a controlled, stable upward climb that is period correct. After attaining altitude the model will cruise in a level pattern that replicates the craft's attitude while just flying along. At some point the model will lose altitude and enter the descent phase. Descent should be a wings-level "glide" that gradually loses height and prepares the model for a nice, controlled landing. As most landing of these models in grass usually result in a cartwheel, wingover or nose over, the actual landing will not count. The flight time must be a minimum of 20 seconds airtime.

On March 17, Glenn Grell and Bruce Hannah put in their official flights for the Coupe Postal contest. They have been flying in this event for the past several years. The event had to be completed in the Northern Hemisphere by the end of March, so time was fleeting.

The day was a dandy with variable winds and relatively warm temps (up to 60 degrees). When all was done, Glenn had put in 5 maxes plus a flyoff max and a second flyoff flight. Bruce had 4 maxes and a non max. Bruce Grell did much of the timing.

On March 18, the weather was pretty much the same and those who came for the club meeting arrived early and did a bit of trimming. Ben Strauss and Robert Hauk, Roger LaPrelle, Ron McBurnett, and Steve Larson were all there along with Glenn and Bruce Grell. Bob Stalick showed up late to kibitz. Steve had some very nice scale rubber flights and was playing with a bright yellow Sparky when I left the field.

WMC Meeting Notes

The meeting was called to order at 2:05 pm at Glenn's shop. There were 10 members present.

The minutes from the previous meeting were read and approved.

Bob Stalick gave the treasurer's report. It was approved.

Old Business

1. Discussion on the NWFFC Events. Some questions were raised about the Combo FAI Event on Saturday. It was decided to place an explanation in the next issue of Patter (see elsewhere in this issue),

The Fun Scale Event will be flown on Sunday after the Lo Doc Scale event. Robert Hauk and Bill Swift will be the judges. (See article elsewhere explaining this event).

Ben Strauss noted some changes for the PeeWee Palooza. (See notice elsewhere in this issue).

It was moved, seconded and unanimously approved to sponsor the listed events for all three contests.

2, Prize purchases. It was moved seconded and unanimously approved to spend up to \$2500 for contest prizes for this summer's meets.

3. Club Bylaws. An update to the club bylaws was headed by Bill Swift with committee members Forrest and Sara Menanno and Roger LaPrelle. Primary changes involve term of office for the treasurer and distribution of club assets upon dissolution. Several other corrections and updates were suggested. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and unanimously passed. A copy of the new bylaws was distributed and will be registered with the AMA.

4. Membership Discussion. The club would like all memberships to be annual beginning in January of each year to simplify record keeping. It was decided to publish an up to date list of the current members and other subscribers in the NL and ask for corrections or changes. This list appears elsewhere in this issue of Patter.

c. Club Table Purchase. At the last meeting, the club authorized Glenn to purchase 6 new tables to replace the old wooden tables we have been using and which are worn out. The last new tables we bought cost around \$65 each. The new price is around \$125. Glenn went online and located some used tables that are identical to those we have. A deal was made with the seller to buy all 20 tables for \$45 each. After some discussion Glenn offered to buy some of the tables for himself if the club did not want all 20. It was moved, seconded and passed unanimously for the club to purchase all 20 tables for \$900.

New Business

1. Robert Hauk suggested we sunset all of the old indoor records and begin a new set of records for indoor.

The reasoning is that we have gone to a no touch system, and with the existing SAHS gym ceiling, none of the old records is apt to be broken. After discussion, it was moved to begin the new records effective December, 2021. Events will be all afternoon duration events plus indoor Cat and HL Glider and P-18.

Motion made seconded and passed unanimously.

2. As noted earlier, Larry Wacken has resigned from his Vice Presidency effective immediately. Bill Swift was nominated to complete his term of office. He was elected unanimously. Bruce Grell was appointed AMA Safety officer.

3. Wall of Fame Inductees: It was moved, seconded and passed to induct Tom Kopriva, Larry Well and Bob Staley into the WMC Wall of Fame. Tom passed away in 2022, and Larry and Bob passed away earlier at an unknown date.

4. AMA Rules Proposals. (next page)

Glenn announced the upcoming rules proposals. Two are general rules and 6 are for outdoor free flight events. All free flight rules proposals affect the electric events. A complete listing with explanations can be found on the AMA website. Glenn's vote is due May 1. Final vote is in August.

7. Bob previewed the NFFS Rules proposals. Three proposals affect Vintage FAI Power and one moves Golden Age from Provisional to Official. The full run down of these proposals will be posted on the NFFS website, and they will also appear in the NFFS Digest. Comments will be accepted and the confirming vote will take effect in the Fall.

Announcements

1. Glenn said he had received a call from Jeri Riley (Steve's widow), and she was intending to donate his model airplane stuff to the club and would deliver it early this summer. There was general agreement that she should receive payment for her generosity. Robert Hauk mentioned Tom Kopriva's model stuff and that he had talked to Earline (Tom's widow) She is interested in having the club purchase his free flight stuff and his electric bike. More conversations with Earline on these transactions are planned. Tom's ashes will be spread on the field at the NWFFC.
2. AMA Walk of Fame Plaque.. After discussion, it was moved, seconded and passed that the club purchase a memorial plaque in Tom's name. Bob will do so.
3. The Annual Unmeeting will be held on May 13. The sometimes annual Delta Dart competition will be held prior to the meeting, weather permitting.
4. The meeting adjourned at 3:44 pm.

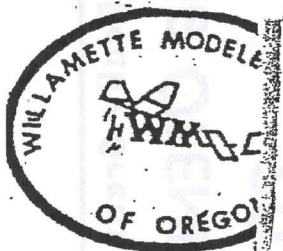

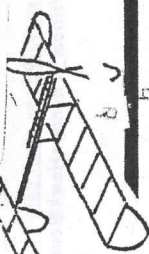
