Vintage FAI and Pro P-30 August 2021 report by Bill Swift, CD

We Must Be In Lost Hills!

After at least 10 days of north northwest winds in reality and in the forecast, the morning of Friday, August 12, dawned with winds persistently from the south. All during registration the wind continued from the south necessitating moving the southern limit of the takeoff box several hundred yards to the south. The decision was taken to avoid moving the trailer, flight line and hydro pond to the south as well with northwest winds again predicted for the rest of the weekend. A test flight confirmed that leaving the flight line where it was would have resulted in all flights going into a dirt field as well as into a landowner's yard, trees and onto his roof. Besides that it was a nice day with temps ranging through the 70's and into the 80's throughout the day.

To accommodate moving contestant gear to the south the first round was extended a half hour. The balance of the normal rounds were all flown at one hour. The flights began to come in. As the day progressed flights were seen to drift in virtually all directions and the wind was quite changeable as massive thermals built. Thermals were everywhere with many models hung-up in rising air with DTs actuated. It reminded me of a day at Lost Hills! As usual the down air was pretty effective as well with several drops throughout the contest.

The nine Pro P-30 contestants were the beneficiaries of lots of the down air as only one contestant achieved the five maxes. As the rounds accumulated, the majority of the drops occurred in the middle rounds. When the rounds were completed, Ates Gurcan was clean all the way through and came in a well-deserved first. Following in second place was Bill Koran, back from a bit of lay-off in the event with Dave Ives defending his Buskell in third place.

It was large crowd in Vintage FAI with fifteen contestants (Guy Mennano entered twice!). There was a single entry in Era 1 and seven entries each in Era 2 and 3. All seven Era 3 models on the field were Cranfield designs. Only one diesel was entered. But what a contest! After all the rounds were flown four fliers were clean and began to fly off. Robert DeShields dropped out in the third fly off round, then Ray Pope dropped in the fifth fly off round while Bob DeShields and Bruce Hannah continued to the eighth round. In that round Bob and Bruce launched within seconds of each other, Bob launching to northwest and Bruce launching to the north. Bob found the down air dropping with 106 seconds to Bruce's max. Bruce came in first flying his Black Shadow, Bob came second flying his Cranfield modified Mr. Max and Ray Pope came third flying his Cranfield replica Lucky Lindy.

Sunday the weather was a little cooler and might have been just a little bit more breezy but the flying was still going strong. As the day progressed, it was noticed by the CD's that additional score sheets were required for at least 5 events as the participation exceeded 7 flyers of those events. Obviously more people were flying more events. All through the contest models were lost and most were found, some a considerable distance away from the launch location. Bruce Grell and I had a great time as your CD's and look forward to next year. Most everyone we talked with had a good time competing and enjoyed the time together with friends from other States. Vintage Wake Contest by Bruce Hannah.

We got started at 8 AM weather was overcast with very little wind about 60 deg. by 8:30 all the fliers had weighed in and we started with 7 fliers. 3 flying era 1, 2 era 2 and 2 had era 3 models so all three era's here represented. I made one mistake of not gathering all the fliers and having them fly from a designated area. They where scattered all over the field from the flying the day before. Getting them to move would have been very unpopular and taken time. This oversight made watching all the different models fly impossible. I could only tell how things were progressing by the time sheet. On top of that I had a timer malfunction on my model that gave me a 22 min. flight. By the time I got back sometime in the third round very few had 3 maxes, and at the end of the fourth only Ates Gurcan was clean. No one ended maxed out. The final result was 1st Bob DeShields, 2nd Ates Gurcan and 3rd Bruce Hannah with only 14 sec. separating 1st and 3rd. Bob was flying a Roger Simpson Mirage from 1964 and Ates a XL56 from 1956 and me a Roger Gregory model called Sky Farer from 1960. Wayne Smith added to the medals we gave with a new front end assembly for each of the winners, Thanks to Wayne for that. I am sorry for not having a more complete report I'll try in the future to do better. The event was very well received giving hope of more participation in the future.

Commentary by Bob Stalick, event CD

It was a misty morning as we gathered on the field for the Vintage FAI and Pro-P 30 event this month. Temperatures to start were in the mid-50's and wouldn't heat up much during the 5 rounds. Since the wind was nearly non-existent, and visibility seemed good, we decided to fly 3 minute maxes. Only six entries were present in Vintage, and only 3 in P-30. But we had a go of it anyhow. Everyone maxed the first round except for Stalick and Mennano. Stalick's Senator had a terrible transition which cost altitude. Mennano-s Jays Bird wasn't trimmed and got him a zero. All the P-30 guys maxed out.

Round 2 was more of the same, but Mennano decided the change models after damaging his Jays Bird during a trimming flight. The replacement was a Bud Romak built Top Banana. Glenn Grell dropped a P-30 flight this round while the others maxed.

Round 3 saw the wind pick up a bit and the mist get more dense. A couple of the high climbers were getting out of sight going up as visibility decreased. Bruce Hannah's Monk's Model headed downwind and glided into a farm building damaging the wing. He changed to his Black Shadow to continue in the next round. Steve Dona's Mr. Max developed a left climb pattern which would prove fatal later. Mennano got his max along with all the other power guys, except Stalick. Vernon dropped a flight in P-30 but Koran was still clean across the board. Round 4 started with 2 minute maxes in Power. Dona's Mr. Max bit the dust, Mennano and Stalick dropped

again. Looks like a three way race between Decker, flying a taper wing Lucky Lindy, Swift, flying his LaBestia and Hannah. All the P-30 fliers maxed the 4th Round, but only Koran has all maxes.

Round 5 begins. The mist is still there but maybe a bit less, as visibility is improving. Stalick gets his first max. Swift drops a flight, and a two way tie exists between Hannah and Decker. Flyoffs follow, and both have erratic engine runs but make their maxes. As the weather improves, the second flyoff flight is ready. Both are away, but Decker's Lindy is down before the 2 minutes, and Hannah wins the event.

In P-30, no drama as Koran wins the event without a flyoff.

Thus ends another Vintage FAI and Pro P-30 event. One more to go this year to determine the winners of the Buskell Trophies. (See standings elsewhere in this issue of Patter).

A Few Random Thoughts From The Editor by Bob Stalick

The time has come to separate the Gas and electric classes in our contests. When we combined these events several years ago, the electric powered models were pretty evenly matched against the piston engined ones. Now the difference is stark. electric simply outperform the gas engines. Time to change. Whether we add A and B Electric is a decision to be made by the club, and I support it, but they should be separated.

The proposed Five Days in Tangent meet under discussion is a big step for our club. There are a number of issues to be resolved before it becomes a reality. Here's a partial list: How many CDs, what events, what is the entry fee, what are the prizes, what days of the week, when is the spaghetti feed, do we arrange for other activities, how many portapots, do we have special events on certain days as we do now with Vintage FAI and Pro P-30, who designs the logo, who does the publicity, who does the entry form and what does it look like, do we do extra advertising? I'm sure there's more, but all of these will need answers, and some will need to be dealt with sooner than later. I think the event has a good chance for success, but we need to do it right. We have a wealth of experience with our three day meets, but adding two days is a stretch.

Flying at The BMFA Nats in 2021 by Robert Hauk

It was a good formula for a vacation, a WMC contest to begin, travel to the UK and participate in their outdoor free flight nationals the next weekend, then return to Oregon and finish with another WMC contest.

Isabelle had to return to the UK this Fall for work and we have been trying to plan a vacation that would include a model flying event in the UK. Their Free Flight Nationals had been cancelled because of the lockdown, along with every other event we were interested in earlier in the Summer. A substitute set of Nationals contests had been organized on the August 28-29 weekend to be held at Salisbury Plain Area 8, a Ministry of Defense training area. Since Isabelle's home base in England is Eastbourne we had a plan. I looked at the rules and decided that the best model to take would be a Gollywock since I could fly it in Combined Rubber on Saturday and Mini Vintage on Sunday. I built a new stooge and built up a tool box and model box that would fit inside a large suitcase.

The models and tools travelled well and when we got to the field everything was ready to go. We arrived early, I filled out the paperwork and paid the fees for entry and then set up my equipment. I put the Gollywock together and since there was a short piece of fuse left in the snuffer tube I thought it might be good to do one short test flight to gauge the conditions. The wind was around 12-14 mph and mostly cloudy with little patches of blue, perfectly good English flying weather (it wasn't raining). This flight was right at 2 minutes, into decent lift, and the flight looked good. I got a taste of what chasing would be like; the area we set up on

had fairly short grass, over the ridge it turned into thigh high weeds. I found the plane easily and with what turned out to be too much confidence I set up for my first official flight. I put in a new piece of fuse and wound up and with Isabelle timing the flight for me, I launched into good lift and the plane was off to a good flight. The plane was a speck when I saw the DT pull at 3 minutes 30 seconds. I watched it coming down and I had a good line even though I didn't see it all the way to the ground. I spent the rest of the day tramping through the thigh high weeds and grass looking for it without success. I talked it through with some of the other fliers and realized it was probably farther away than I had guessed, I didn't think I could see a Wock at much more than half a mile distance.

The next morning I spent a bit of time on Google Maps. I had the test flight to calibrate my search, I knew where the plane was launched from and where it landed so it was fairly easy to make an estimate of how The first official flight was probably in the air for 5 minutes and this far the plane had gone in the 2 minutes. translated to 1.25 miles, definitely out of the Ministry of Defense property. One of the guys loaned me his GPS, we went to the launch position and he took the coordinates, and then put in a waypoint on the compass bearing of my line. Isabelle and I walked down the road and out of the MoD property and into the flying field and with the GPS found the line. The Gollywock was found right on the line, and right at the predicted distance. I'm glad I did that test flight so I had a way to estimate the distance. The Wock was fine after a night out. I did some test glides and it seemed fine so back we went to fly. My first two flights in Mini Vintage were maxes, and the chases weren't too bad. Then I made a stupid mistake on the third flight, the stab was up on the stop so the third flight was 27 seconds long, enough to be official. I was the tide that raised all boats, in dead last place among those who did all three official flights. The biggest difference I saw in our UK dead last place among those who did all three official flights. The biggest difference I saw in our UK colleagues flying, apart from flying in such wind, was how they handle flyoffs. At the end of the day everyone who is maxed out flies a single flyoff flight, whoever has the highest time wins, either they set very long DT times, or just disable the DT. The flyoffs were about 6 minutes long, the wind was dropping a bit late in the day but still those models were over 1.5 miles out. No wonder they all use trackers of some

I had a great time, and met some really good modelers. I want to go back and do it all again, without the stupid mistakes of course. Thank you to Mike Woodhouse for organizing this event on short notice. Thank you to all my new flying friends for the help and encouragement when I had a lost model on the field.






